



Young Birders of Greater Hood County

Are you young and interested in learning about birds and how to identify them? Come join us during the peak of spring migration for the first bird walk of the Young Birders Group of Greater Hood County at the Acton Nature Center led by young birder and Master Naturalist Jake Balmuth. During this walk we will be identifying and counting the number of birds we see and hear. We are likely to see some of the species that frequent the ANC, such as Northern Cardinal, Carolina Chickadee, Blue-gray Gnat Catcher and Black-chinned Hummingbird, but, as this walk will be during migration, we have the chance to see some species that are more unusual visitors to the ANC as well, like this Dickcissel singing atop a mesquite tree.

This walk is intended for youth older than ten who are interested in birds and birding, however parents with younger children are certainly welcome as well.

When: April 22nd 7:00 – 10 am

What to bring: good hiking shoes, long pants, insect repellent, sun hat/sunscreen, binoculars, if you have them
