Special Announcements: A farewell to Jan Bussey was presented accompanied by a slideshow of photos of Jan and friends. Jan was a founding member of RBMN. For many years, Jan served as the primary contact between the chapter and Fossil Rim Wildlife Center providing training on Volunteers as Teachers. She will be greatly missed.

Guests/New members: Billy Teels introduced his daughter and grandchildren. Visitors Walt and Marge Helgesen and new member Lori Magers were introduced and welcomed.

Dinner: Began after the tribute to Jan and welcomes. Time was approximately 6:10.

Program: Billy Teels presented a program sharing his recent visit to the Amazon. Many photos accompanied Billy's presentation among which were birds, fish, mammals, insects, and reptiles of the region, lodging and outings, local destinations and native residents, and other adventures in which he and his wife Phyllis participated.

After outlining the logistics of his journey and some history of the region, Billy shared some interesting facts. The Amazon is about the size of the USA and the Amazon River is the largest river in the world. There are over 1500 species of birds, 750 species of trees, and 5600 species of fish. Only 3-4% of sunlight reaches the rainforest floor. 20% of the world's oxygen is produced in the rainforest of the Amazon.

Rainfall totals are 80-120 inches annually. Billy's narrative contained many more facts, comparisons, descriptions, and personal experiences regarding his trip.
